

Fee Modernization

Consumer Price Indexing

- Annual increase for all fees (existing and new)
- Ensures that fees keep pace with inflation

Performance Standards

 Establish and publish service standards for every single service with fees

Service Fees Act (2017)


Annual Reporting

- Report on costs of providing service
- Report on revenues generated by fees


Remission Policy

 Circumstances where a portion of the fees could be returned if performance standards are not met

Fee Modernization - MOC Registration Program



KEY PRINCIPAL of COST RECOVERY INITIATIVE:

Service recipients receiving a direct benefit above those enjoyed by the general public should pay a greater share of the costs.

DIRECT BENEFIT to MOC FACILITIES:

Ability to operate a business in the MOC World.

Initial Consultation

- ➤ Initial consultation was completed in November 2018.
- ➤ Four (4) ranges of fees based on complexity and effort applied to 211 services:
 - Category 1 (Low complexity services, \$750 to \$1,000);
 - Category 2 (Medium complexity services, \$1,870 to \$2,490);
 - Category 3 (High complexity services, \$3,360 to \$4,480); or
 - Category 4 (Very high complexity services, \$5,230 to \$6,970).
- > Fees are applicable to any facility, agency or individual that requires a certificate of registration to conduct an activity under a safety standard
 - Initial registration
 - Renewals
 - Amendments (administrative, technical, scope changes)
- > Two (2) service standard options are being proposed

New Proposal





Simplified fee structure

Original proposal defined every service by its:

- Standard
- Type of facility/Design
- Type of MOC
- Type of activity
- Type of application
 - = 211 services to choose from




New Proposal groups every service into one of eight (8) service categories:

- 1. Container Facilities: Initial Registration
- 2. Container Facilities: Renewal Request
- 3. Third party agencies: Initial Registration
- 4. Third party agencies: Renewal Request
- 5. Design Engineer: Initial Registration
- 6. Design Engineer: Renewal Request
- 7. Fleet operators: Initial Registration
- 8. Fleet operators: Renewal Request



Bonus: No fees for amendment requests!

Program Cost



Estimated Cost to TC for registration program: \$4M Estimated cost recovered: just under \$1M (24% of total cost)





Consistent cost to maintain registration (Example of cost to a Highway Tank facility)

In the **original proposal**, fees are applied throughout the renewal cycle (every five (5) years)



In the **new proposal**, fees are applied only at initial registration and renewals (every five (5) years)




Updated service standard

The **original service standard proposal** included two (2) options for consideration

- 15 business days to assign a file to a TC Official; or
- 90 business days* for TC official to complete a review.

The new service standard proposes

 45 business days* for a decision from a TC official to issue a certificate or require an inspection, once all documents are received.

Next Steps

- Develop digital solutions for an online stakeholder platform to submit applications
- Develop guidance materials on the introduction of service fees
- Prepublication in Canada Gazette, Part I (CGI) in fall 2021
